**The Global Energy Transition congress and exhibition, held in Milan from July 1-3, united low-carbon energy sectors and high-carbon industries around the pressing need to develop and scale decarbonisation technologies that can accelerate the energy transition.**

The inaugural event convened over 7,000 visitors, 1,500 delegates and 300 Ministers, CEOs and business leaders for 3 days of high-level discussion and collaboration, focusing on the urgent need to drive forward decarbonisation in climate-critical sectors.

Alongside these critical debates, the international exhibition featured over 100 companies from across the energy industry and hard-to-abate sectors showcasing world leading decarbonisation projects and cutting-edge technologies that can deliver an inclusive and efficient path to net zero.

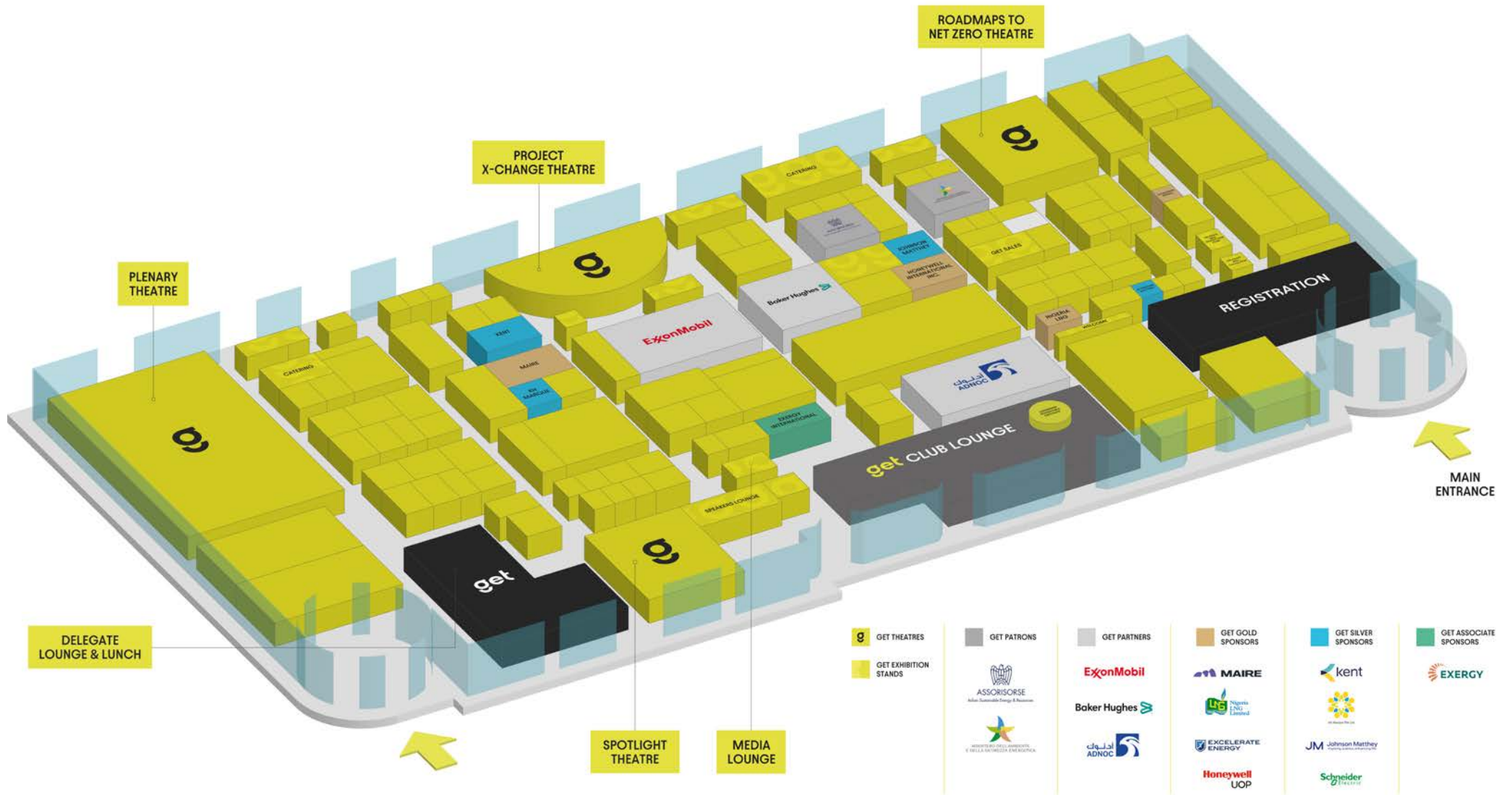

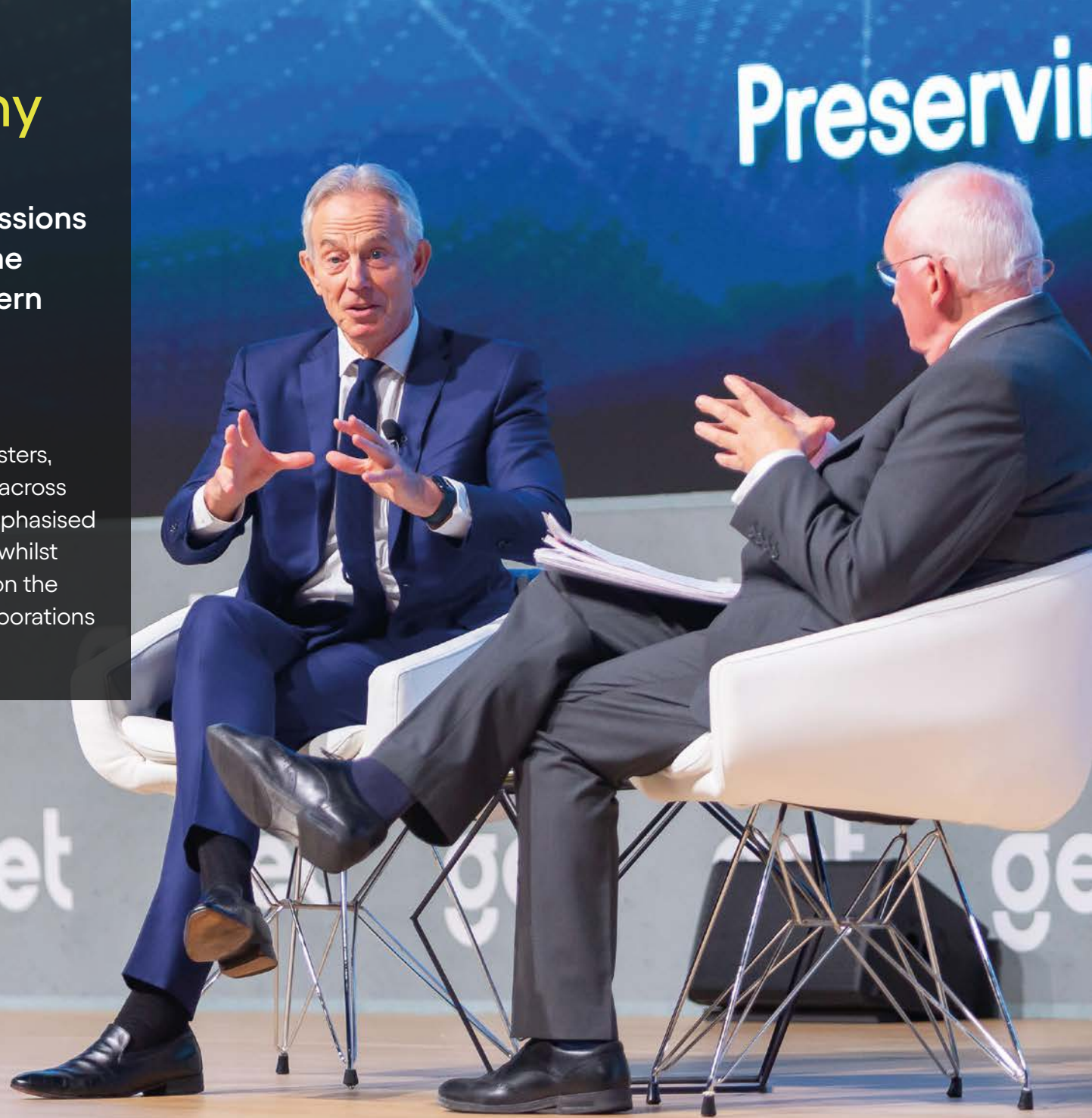




# Opening Ceremony

# Strategic Conference

**Three days of action focused discussions to support the acceleration of the global energy transition.**

The Strategic Conference delivered critical insights and solutions for transformational progress across the energy ecosystem. The Ministerial panel explored pathways to a just and equitable transition, while NATO shared thoughts on the intersection of energy and security. Leading CEOs discussed balancing energy portfolios with the demand for lower carbon solutions.

# Strategic Conference Highlights

## Coherent International Action on the Energy Transition.

In this opening panel, Ministers from Sierra Leone, Mozambique, Pakistan, Nigeria, Egypt and Azerbaijan focused on the critical role of global cooperation in achieving net zero emissions by 2050. The discussion emphasized the need for nonpartisan engagement and evidence-based actions, as highlighted by the outcomes of COP 28 and the “UAE consensus.”

Within the Lounge, the most influential players working across the energy transition were invited to convene in a series of invitation-only leadership roundtables held under the Chatham House rule.



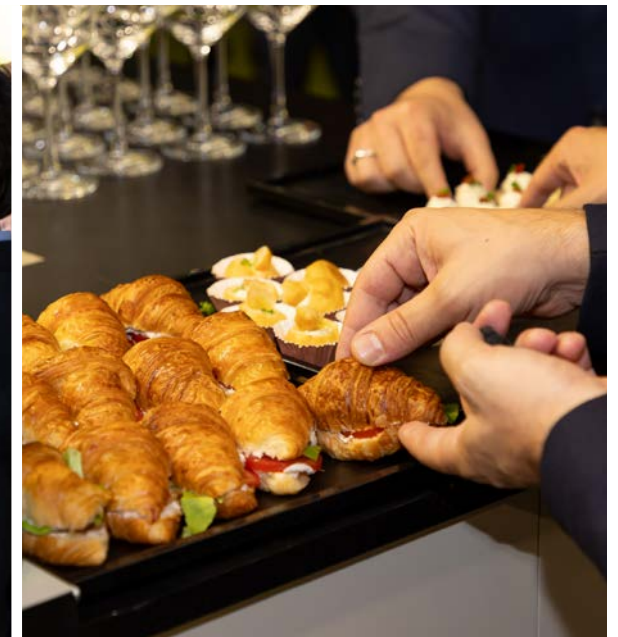

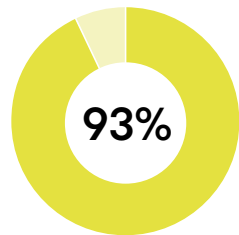
Exhibitor by sector



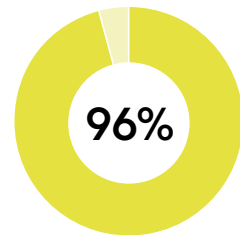
Attendee by professional profile



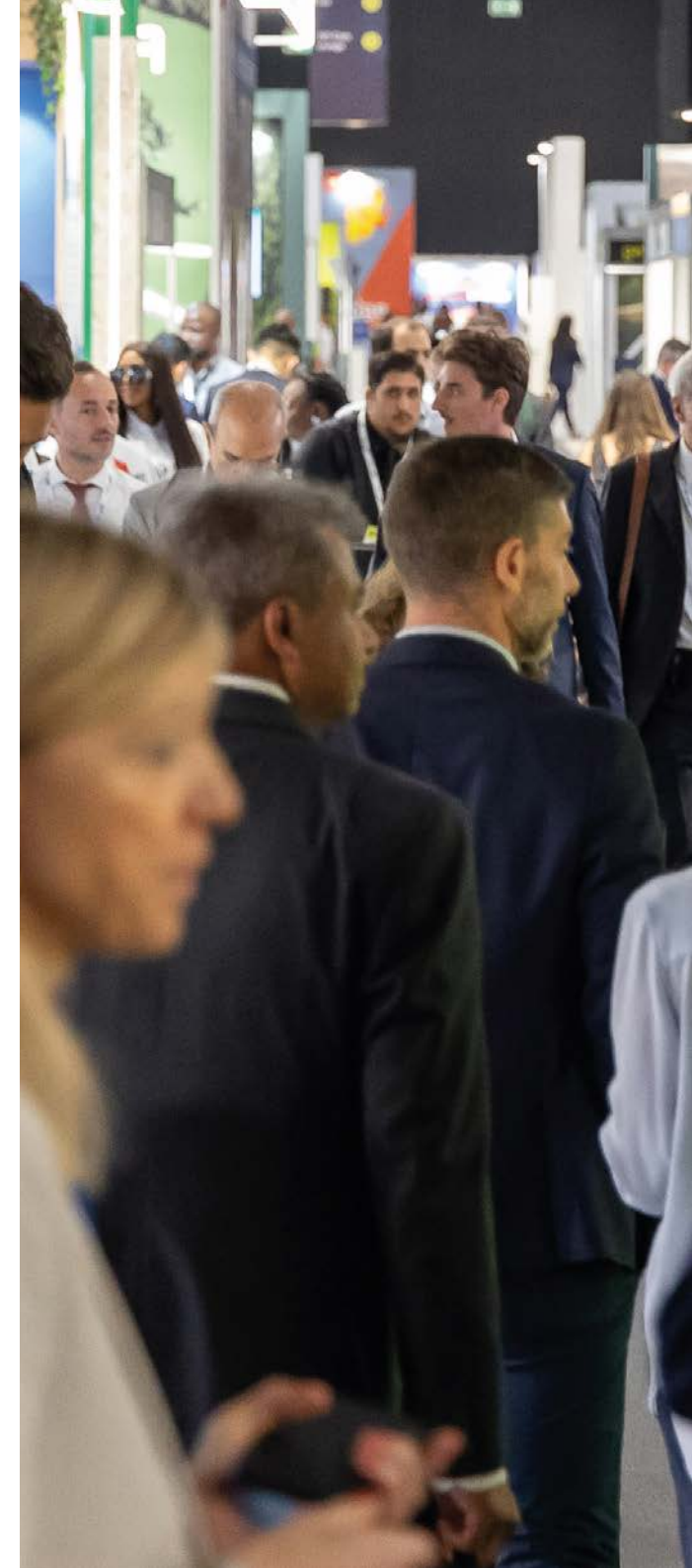

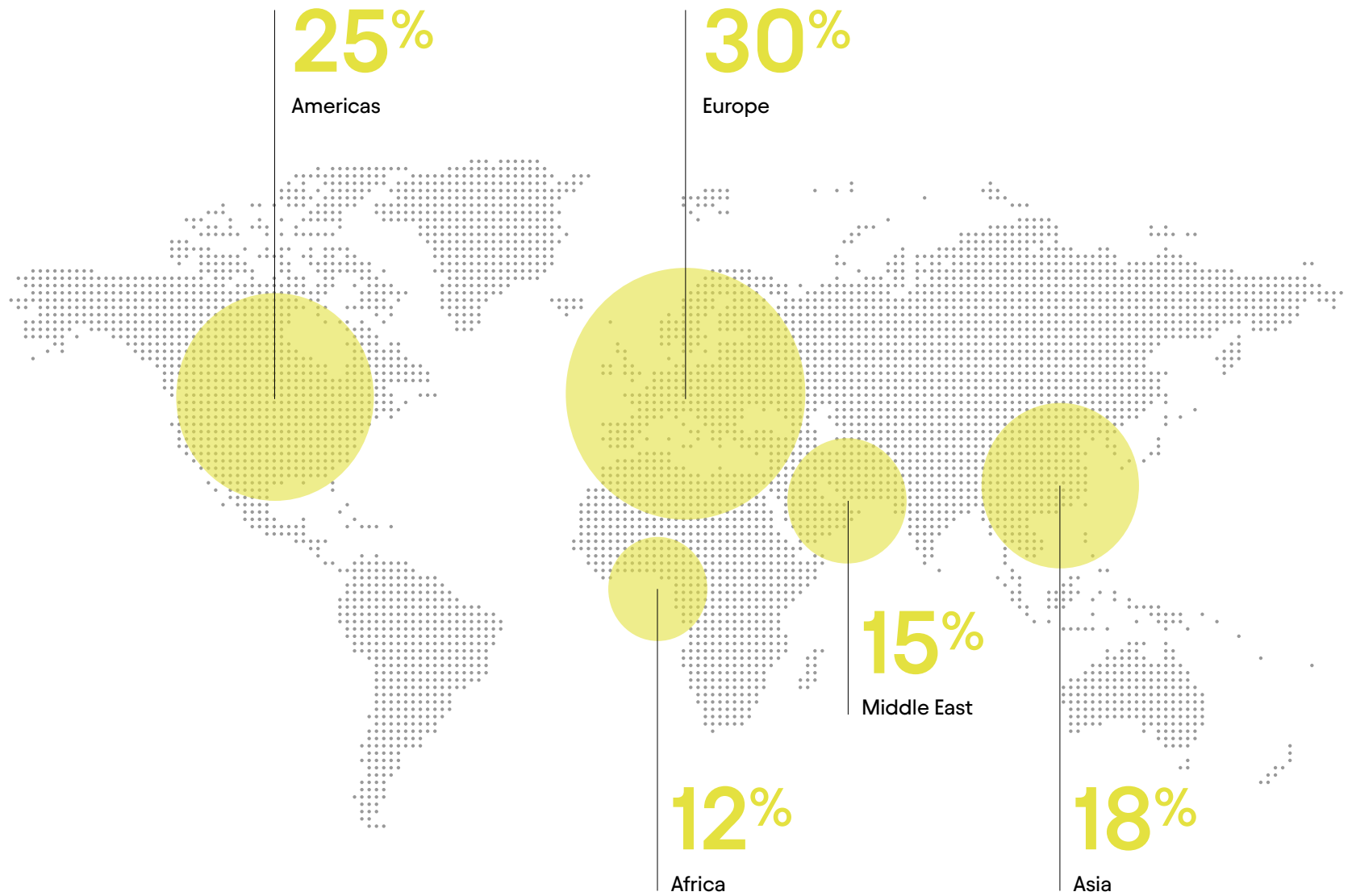
